The Ravenna cement plant has produced materials for the construction industry since 1962, including projects like the World Trade Center Memorial and the new Giants Stadium. The plant employs 150 workers who produce 2.2 million metric tons of cement annually. It is both the largest employer and the largest property taxpayer in Southern Albany County.

The Ravenna plant is part of LafargeHolcim, the leading cement producer in the U.S. Headquartered in Chicago, Illinois, we have resources across the country, whether operating under the name Lafarge, Holcim, Aggregate Industries or Lattimore Materials.

A three-year project in 2017 brought in dry kiln technology and improved efficiency at the plant, allowing it to use 42 percent less fuel, produce 40 percent less solid waste, and consume less water. This effort produced up to 800 construction jobs and generated more than \$170 million to the local economy.

Air pollution controls monitored in near real-time make the Ravenna facility one of the world's most environmentally friendly cement plants. All local, state, and federal standards and regulations are met and exceeded whenever possible.

The health and safety of our workforce, partners, visitors, and the surrounding community are our top priority. Lafarge has innovative and effective procedures to maintain the safest possible working environment and regularly monitors and follows local, state, and federal guidance on workplace safety and public health protocols.

We are accelerating green construction by joining the net-zero pledge with science-based targets. We have ambitious company-wide goals to reduce our overall carbon footprint, and we offer a wide range of sustainable products and services.

The Ravenna plant supports local organizations, projects, and events, including Coeymans Riverfest and the Ravenna Friendship Festival. It has donated masonry cement and materials to local school districts and looks forward to deepening ties to the local community.
